About our panel:

Erin Tuttle is one of the two moms that started the movement against Common Core when her child came home from a private Catholic school and realized there was something wrong with the way her child was learning math. Along with another mom from the school, Heather Crossin, the two started crisscrossing the state of Indiana educating others about the dangers of Common Core. Together they built a statewide movement and stopped the implementation of Common Core in Indiana.

Dr. Duke Pesta received his M.A. in Renaissance literature from John Carroll University and his Ph.D. in Shakespeare and Renaissance literature from Purdue University. He has taught at major research institutions and small liberal arts colleges, and has been active in educational reform, developing and implementing an elective Bible course that is currently available for public high school students in Texas. He is a professor of English at the University of Wisconsin, Oshkosh, and the Academic Director of Freedom Project Education.
